George Hastings Begins New Term As Commissioner

U.S. Commissioner George C. Hastings was sworn in for another four-year term in his federal post Thursday.

Commissioner Hastings, a partner in the Hartford law firm of Robinson, Robinson and Cole, took the oath of office for his second term from U.S. District Court Deputy Clerk-in-Charge Sylvester Markowski.

The Hartford attorney's reappointment was made by the state's four U.S. District Court judges, William H. Timbers, M. Joseph Blumenfeld, T. Emmet Clarie and Robert C. Zampano.

Hastings has served as treasurer of the National Assn. of U.S. Commissioners. He is a graduate of Yale University, '48 and Yale Law School, '56. He served in the Army during the Korean War. After graduation from law school, he served as law clerk for one year to Federal Judge Robert P. Anderson.
