The giving of new duties to magistrates corresponds with a recent campaign by Judge Timpers to reduce what he termed ast August as "an extraordinary and unprecedented backog of criminal and civil cases" n the federal court system.

In the fall, Judge Timbers called into the state two federal judges from New York and Vernont to help reduce the heavy case load.

In addition. U.S. Atty. Stewart H. Jones announced recently that the Justice Department has authorized four more assistant J.S. attorneys and five clerical workers for the state's federal listrict.
