As U.S. commissioner, Parker will hold preliminary hearings and issue warrants for suspects arrested on federal charges. He is charged with the responsibility of determining whether a crime has been committed and whether the suspect in custody may be held responsible to answer to the federal judges. The commissioner does not determine guilt or innocense. Succeeds Hastings

Parker succeeds Atty. George C. Hastings, also of West Hartford, who resigned last week to accept endorsement as the Democratic candidate for the Board of Education in that town.

Parker was nominated for the post by U.S. District Judge M. Joseph Blumenfeld and Judge Clarie, Chief U.S. District Judge William H. Timbers and Judge Robert C. Zampano also approved the appointment.

Atty. Thomas F. Parker of new post, Judge Clarie said he ing his one year term as law Parker, an associate in the clerk which ended in September of 1963.

Parker was named law clerk after graduating with honors the University of Confrom necticut Law School. He ranked first in his class in the evening division.

Was Filing Officer

While attending law school, Parker who is 29, served as chief filing officer for the Uniform Commercial Code in the office of the Connecticut secretary of the state. He was also an assistant to the elections division attorney in the same office.

The new commissioner is a graduate of Fordham University, class of '57. He served in the Army in 1957 and 1958. He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. John M. Parker of 42 Brookline Dr., West Hartford.

He is married to the former Julia K. Smith, daughter of Ernest M. Jennings of Mrs. Wethersfield and the late Burke Smith of West Hartford. The couple live at 5 Milton St., West Hartford. They have one In swearing-in Parker to his daughter, Katherine, 10 months.
