ORDER

SCHEDULE FOR FORFEITURE OF COLLATERAL

(United States Department of Interior Fish and Wildlife Service)

Pursuant to Rule 58(d), Federal Rules of Criminal Procedure, this Court hereby orders that the Forfeiture of Collateral in Lieu of Appearance Schedule for the specified Fish & Wildlife violations, attached hereto as "Exhibit A," be and is hereby adopted and promulgated to become effective this date. This Schedule of Collateral, as adopted herein, represents the misdemeanor and petty offenses for which collateral may be posted and forfeited in lieu of appearance by the person charged, together with the amount of the collateral to be posted for such offenses committed under the various enumerated United States Fish and Wildlife violations.

All previous Schedules of Forfeiture of Collateral in Lieu of Appearance relating to violations of Fish and Wildlife statutes in this District are hereby superceded and canceled.

WILDLIFE/PROPERTY FORFEITURE

Unless otherwise specifically ordered by the United States District Court for the District of Connecticut, any fish, wildlife, plants, or property which has been seized within the jurisdiction of the District of Connecticut under the authority of the Migratory Bird Treaty Act, 16 U.S.C. §§ 703-712; the National Wildlife Refuge System Administration Act, 16 U.S.C.

§ 668dd-668ee; The Eagle Protection Act, 16 U.S.C. § 668-668c; the Endangered Species Act, 16 U.S.C. § 1531 et seq; the Migratory Waterfowl Hunting Stamp Act, 16 U.S.C. § 718-718h; the Airborne Hunting Act, 16 U.S.C. § 742j-l; the Marine Mammal Protection Act, 16 U.S.C. § 1361-1407; the Tariff Classification Act, 19 U.S.C. § 1202; the Lacey Act, 18 U.S.C. § 42; the Lacey Act Amendments, 16 U.S.C. §§ 1371-3378; the American Antiquities Act, 16 U.S.C. §§ 431-433; The African Elephant Conservation Act, 16 U.S.C. §§ 4201-4245; the Archeological Resources Protection Act, 16 U.S.C. §§ 470aa et. seq.; Rhinoceros and Tiger Conservation Act of 1998, 16 U.S.C. §§ 5301-5306; and the Wild Bird Conservation Act, 16 U.S.C. §§ 4901-4916, where final disposition of the case has been made by either payment of a forfeiture of collateral or a judgment by the court on behalf of the government, and where so authorized by statute, such wildlife or property shall be forfeited to the United States Government and disposed of by the United States Fish and Wildlife Service in the manner prescribed by Title 50, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 12.

Dear Chief Judge Chatigny:

On September 9, 1987, this Court adopted a "General Order of Offenses Related to The United States Fish & Wildlife Service" establishing a forfeiture of collateral schedule by which a violator may pay a fine in lieu of appearing in court. The criminal laws and regulations governing Fish and Wildlife violations, found in Title 50 of the Code of Federal Regulations and Titles 16 and 18 of the United States Code, have undergone numerous revisions during the past seventeen years and there are several violations not covered by the existing fine schedule. Furthermore, as you know, inflation has significantly impacted the dollar, greatly diminishing the deterrent effect of the current fine list.

Accordingly, it is respectfully requested that the attached updated fine schedule for such offenses in the District of Connecticut be approved and adopted.

If you have any questions or desire to discuss this matter further, agents from the Fish & Wildlife Service and I would be happy to meet with you.

NOTE: Due to increased liability and potential severity for environmental degradation posed by commercial and organized activities, the collateral amounts for violations listed herein shall be doubled. MANDATORY COURT APPEARANCES OR ARRESTS

Recognizing the concern of the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service regarding recidivists and aggravated offenses it is herein provided that if, within the discretion of the law enforcement officer, the offense is of an aggravated nature, the law enforcement officer, not withstanding the preceding Forfeiture of Collateral Schedule, may require mandatory appearance before the presiding United States Magistrate Judge. Nothing herein shall prohibit the law enforcement officer from arresting a person for the commission of any offense including those for which collateral may be posted and forfeited and taking said person immediately before a United States Magistrate Judge.

FISH, WILDLIFE & PLANT VALUATION TABLE

Replacement values may be added to the collateral amounts. Values shall be assessed on a per capita basis (i.e. separate value added for each fish, wildlife and plant species possessed, transported, killed, etc. in violation of the law).
